### PRESIDENT MESSAGE FROM THE



Summer is nearly over with -- vacations, road trips, family visits and our first inperson Board of Directors meeting since February of 2020 now firmly in the rearview mirror. The Board meeting was actually a hybrid, with about 24 people attending in Oakland. As can be

expected, there were some technological challenges with the hybrid meeting. Thank you to all who weathered the storm, particularly David Kendall who took the hybrid meeting concept to a new level, attending part of the meeting on-line and then arriving at the in-person site after lunch to finish out the day. Our November 6, 2021 meeting will be back to the on-line format, and hopefully we will all be together again in February of 2022.

Additional highlights from the meeting included:

- The Public Awareness Committee leading the effort to develop pathways to help military personnel transition from military service to a career in civilian land surveying. The first candidate to send us his resume has already begun work at a Sacramento firm.
- A team was formed to analyze the results from the Annual CLSA Survey and help identify areas where CLSA can improve how we serve the professional land surveyors of California.
- The announcement of the signing of CLSA sponsored legislation Senate Bill 414.
- The MOU for the 2022 Conference was signed and ratified
- CLSA funds were transferred to a new bank offering a better return on our investment, as well as diversifying the location of our funds to maintain FDIC coverage.
- Executive Director Kim Oreno called 174 nonrenewed corporate members of whom 30 renewed their CLSA memberships immediately.
- The Board of Directors voted to reinstate CRTN • Consortium membership in the 2022 budget. A California student won 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the National
- Trig-Star competition.
- CLSA continues to hold webinars (free to CLSA members). The next is September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE CLSA Sponsored Bill SB 414 (Jones)

CLSA is pleased to report that Governor Newsom has signed SB 414 (Jones), relating to land surveying. The bill was sponsored by CLSA in response to suggestions from members and chapters. The bill includes the following elements:

- Amends Business and Professions Code Section 8726 to create a definition of "cadastral" surveying. Current law limits to licensed land surveyors the practice of both geodetic and cadastral surveying, but fails to include a definition of cadastral. The bill incorporates the definition established by the Bureau of Land Management;
- Amends Section 8764 to clarify that surveyors may include in records of survey, data in both graphic and narrative form, necessary for the intelligent interpretation of the information contained in the surveys;
- Amends Section 8780, relating to disciplinary actions against surveyors, to separate accusations based upon negligence from those based upon incompetence, so that surveyors may be better informed of alleged violations of the two different standards;
- Amends Section 66452.5 of the Government Code, to extend the timeline for conducting appeals of Subdivision Map Act decisions, from 30 to 45 days from request. CLSA members have reported that the 30-day limit made it difficult to conduct appeals within the requisite timeframe.

CLSA extended appreciation to Senator Jones for agreeing to carry SB 414, and for the hard work he and his staff put in to secure passage of the bill. All of the changes are effective on January 1, 2022.

# Australian mathematician reveals world's oldest example of applied geometry



A clay tablet kept in an Istanbul museum is the oldest example of applied geometry. The tablet, cataloged as Si 427, "dates from the Old Babylonian (OB) period – 1900 to 1600 BCE," says lead researcher Dr. Daniel

Mansfield from UNSW Science's School of Mathematics and Statistics.

Si 427 is "the only known example of a cadastral document from the OB period, which is a plan used by surveyors to define land boundaries. In this case, it tells us legal and geometric details about a field that's split after some of it was sold off."

An OB surveyor made it with a stylus on clay. A diagram of a field appears on the front. The field is being divided and some of it sold. The lines are there to demarcate the boundaries of the various fields. The boundaries were constructed at right angles using 3, 4, 5 triangles.

"The discovery and analysis of the tablet have important implications for the history of mathematics," Dr. Mansfield says. "For instance, this is over a thousand years before Pythagoras was born."

## Dehydrated Workers Prompt Emergency Rescue Operation In Winston-Salem

Two surveyors working in a hard-to-reach area in southeast Winston-Salem got dehydrated Monday, and emergency crews mounted a rescue operation to bring them to safety.

The surveyors were in an area off Cole Road covered with trees and brush, and it was initially difficult for emergency crews to find them. The call came in initially around 1 p.m. as affecting only one surveyor, but it turned out that both people on the two-man crew had become dehydrated and needed help, reports showed.

Multiple firefighters and emergency medical services workers converged at the property on Cole Road, but there was initial confusion about where the men were and how to get onto the property to bring them out. "They couldn't even access (the area) with an ATV," said Capt. S.P. Harber of the Winston-Salem Fire Department, during the early stages of the rescue effort.

The surveyors were out of the woods and out of trouble by 2:30pm.

## COFFMAN LAND SURVEYORS RACE TO 2ND PLACE FINISH

The website for the firm says "Coffman Land has a *track record* of successfully delivering topquality performance" and now Rick Coffman has a trophy to prove it.



Rick (PLS 9312) and his unidentified co-driver participated in their first SXS (side by side) UTV (Utility Terrain Vehicle) race. Their debut was in Ridgecrest California, on Saturday, July 10, 2021. Those familiar with that location will not be

Coffman continued, "My goal was to simply finish the race and put the car back onto the trailer under its own power. Going home after standing on the podium makes it much more worthwhile." That sounds like the patience, determination, and perseverance that goes into studying for and passing the California Professional Land Surveyor exam. Rick's racing adventure started as an outlet to his "everyday grind" of owning and operating his land surveying business. ## H.R. 4664 – THE FIRESHEDS ACT By Warren Smith

On July 26, Michael Quartaroli and I were invited to meet via Teams with Curtis Sumner, Executive Director of NSPS, John Byrd, Federal Lobbyist, and Paul Johnson, Legislative Director for Representative Blake Moore (UT, 1<sup>St</sup> District) to present our case for an amendment to H.R. 4664 – the FIRESHEDS Act.

Mike and I, along with Curt Sumner, advocated for language to preserve existing survey monuments within the proposed fuel reduction and firebreak areas. This would consist of inventorying, tying out, and replacing if necessary those monuments within the impacted areas.

## NGS GPS ON BENCH MARKS AUGUST 2021 UPDATE

The CLSA is once again supporting NGS's crowd-sourced data collection program called GPS on BenchMarks (GPSonBM). The program takes full advantage of modern technology and dramatically improves the accuracy of height measurements and tools provided by NGS that are utilized by private firms and public agencies. The push is on to support the program with less than 5 months remaining til the deadline of December 31, 2021. That is the cutoff to submit GPS data that NGS can guarantee will be analyzed to compute the initial set of 2020.0 Reference Epoch Coordinates (RECs) to be released with the Modernized NSRS. This initial set of RECs is currently the only set that NGS can guarantee will be used to build the 2022 Transformation Tool. Additional sets of RECs will be computed on a regular basis as new data is submitted.

These observations will go into NADCON and VERTCON grids which transform into the modernized NSRS at 2020.00. Observations turned in after the deadline will continue to be used by NGS for improvement of the NSRS, including (a) adding to the pool of 2020.0 RECs (b) creating SECs (c) being used in 2025.0 (or 2030.0) REC computations and thus in later NADCON/VERTCON grids.

Some additional reasons GPS on Benchmarks are needed include:

- The Geoid18 campaign back in 2018 had a 30 km spacing goal to constrain the hybrid geoid model.
- The Transformation Tool Campaign has a 10km spacing goal to better resolve the geographic variations in the differences between the NAVD 88 and NAPGD2022 surfaces
- Because these differences change more quickly in areas of high topographic relief (hills or mountains), there are 2km spacing targets set in populated areas to further improve the transformations in those areas.
- The Modernized NSRS will be accessed through GNSS observations, and the time dependent features of the new

receptive to our proposal, and was pleased with our description of the value of physical monuments in defining not just Federal boundaries, but in controlling those of private landowners. He indicated that it stood a good chance of being inserted in the proper portion of the Bill in committee.

He also raised the potential for the use of a trained labor pool from the proposed new Civilian Conservation Corp project which, if passed, would constitute a valuable workforce for transition to land surveying.

system will be realized through crowdsourced GPS data submitted to NGS over time.

• Users are encouraged to collect and submit data on marks that are important to their work and get used to doing this on a regular basis to derive the most benefit from the Modernized NSRS

To participate and contribute your part – you will need a dual frequency GPS receiver, a fixed height GPS rod (recommended), a camera and the ability to record 4 hours of static GPS data.
