The Legislative Committee (LegCom) has made significant progress in updating the Lot Line Adjustment and Monumentation guidelines, ensuring the highest standards of accuracy and consistency in land surveying practices. We have also approved a letter of support from the President to NGS expressing our support for two Low Distortion Projections in the Bay area and the LA Basin.

We had great success with our hybrid Audio Visual setup for members who logged into Zoom. This enabled us to connect and share information with our members in a safe and convenient way.

My top three priorities as the new President of CLSA are as follows. Firstly, I am committed to promoting diversity and increasing the number of women in our profession. IN THE NEWS...

CLSA, CSDS and San Joaquin County Sheriff Team-up

CLSA Executive Director Kim Oreno received a call from Detective Matthew Miley of San Joaquin County. The Detective spotted a for sale listing of a Trimble S7 on an on-line marketplace for \$5,000 that had signs of being stolen. On his drive into work, Miley spotted Caltrans District 10 Surveyors Joe



Clary, Doug Hammerstrom, and Matt Olson, and approached them to ask about approximate value of the S7 and how to reach the survey community. Clary and Hammerstrom suggested reaching out to CLSA and Olson suggested contacting CSDS. (Miley and his partner work undercover, so the photo is only a likeness)

Kim sent out an email blast to CLSA's email list, resulting in numerous emails with police reports and serial numbers of their stolen instruments. One CLSA member who reached out to the detective was confirmed to be the victim of the theft through his company records and confirmation by California Surveying and Drafting Supply company out of Sacramento.

The instrument was stolen in Modesto in November of 2022. After a sting operation, the Trimble S7 is now back in the possession of its rightful owner and there have been two arrests made with this case. One of which was the person who tried to sell it and who later confirmed that he knew it was in fact stolen. The other was the person who drove him to the meet up spot. The Detective commented "You have a great group of association members. I have posted many Be On the Look Outs (BOLO's) in the past, and have never received such an immediate response from so many people."




