Always.

Working for a County, I regularly receive maps for review that have a facsimile of my stamp on them. I know the submitting surveyors aren't being malicious; they're generally trying to be helpful. My requests to remove the facsimile from their maps (and company computers) is usually met with surprise, sometimes with incredulousness, and one surveyor who wanted to argue with me claiming his map looked better with a CAD stamp.

This is how I control my stamp and how it gets used. This is how I verify who I am. With only one exception, everything I've stamped in my nearly 18 years of licensure have been wet stamped, and wet signed in blue. I don't bend on this.

I wish it was that easy with emails.

Two days ago (12 August 2024), I began receiving messages from many of you, from all over the State. Multiple emails, a couple of phone calls, and a text message to alert me that I may have been hacked. It's not a hack, per se, but it is a spoofing attack. Someone is claiming to be me.

Thankfully, they're not very good at it. Poor english skills and misspellings are giveaways. Another is being asked to "... bring happiness to some of our members ... with gift [sp] voucherss ..." That's not how this Association operates.

I'm thankful that so many of you can see through the scam, and that so many of you reached out to me and the Central Office to let us know. This is, unfortunately, a scam that happens to this Association often. It has happened to two other groups I associate with, to various degrees, but their modus operandi is always the same: pretend to be a Board member, reach out asking for help, and ask for an untraceable method of moving funds around to "help" someone. Sometimes it's even the same request - down to the language used and misspellings - for the different organizations. Just another benefit to an organization having an online presence.

I have contacted many of you over the past few years. It's always been from the email address or phone number listed at the end of this message (both in blue), as it's been with every eNews message I've penned this year. It will continue to be soand I'll never ask you for a gift card.

Many thanks To those of you who participated in the 2024 Annual Data Collection Survey. The Survey Committee met on August 13th and are working on a presentation of the data to the Association on a date yet to be determined.


WHERE IN CALIFORNIA IS THIS?



The July "Where in CA is This?" was posted several months ago, along with the UAS aerial image, in LinkedIn by Aaron Chamberlin, PE, a Senior Transportation Engineer (Specialist) at Caltrans. "Caltrans Newest Real Time Network (CTSRN) station was constructed this week near Olancha, CA. Absolutely stunning country, complete with Joshua Trees, and a Roadrunner (no Coyote... (2)) This one may have beat Gleason Beach for scenery. Multiple Air Force and Navy Jets were seen and heard (F-18, F-15, and F-35's) throughout the day overhead. The new alignment of US-395 can be seen in both directions from the site from the UAS photos." The station supports "upgrading a 12-mile section of US 395 from 2-lane conventional highway to 4-lane expressway using a new alignment. The existing section of the road has high accident rates, so the project seeks to address safety first and foremost." Thank you Caltrans for the photos.

Only two identification attempts at the location, and both were correct. Serial geo-locater Bill Tuck, PLS, was the first, remarking "I recognized that house as soon as I saw it. This is just up the road from the Crystal Geyser warehouses off HWY 395 near Olancha. This must be a new GPS station being as it doesn't show up on Google Street View. I tried to look this up but I didn't see anything for this on NGS or USGS. If you have a source for this I would be interested in looking it up. Anyways, see screenshot below (to the left)." John Canby, LSIT, also recognized the area: "This month's CLSA newsletter location photograph is on the east side of the Sierras along highway 395, just north of Olancha, looking SW to Olancha Peak. I hiked and rock climbed up that canyon in the late 1990s, and recognized the rocks as soon as I saw the photo. A slice of God's country!" These two have spent some time in the Sierras!



UN Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM)

The 14th session of the United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM) last week focused on collaborative and action-oriented approaches to strengthen geospatial capacity and leadership. Challenges posed by varying national and regional contexts were raised and the need for cross-sectoral partnerships was emphasized.

Some of our key take aways include:

• Research and Education: There was a call for increased collaboration between the networks and countries to bolster geospatial capabilities and support the implementation of the Integrated Geospatial Information Framework (IGIF).

• Geospatial Capacity for Sustainable Development: The need for enhanced geospatial information and products to support the SDGs was underscored, with many countries requiring additional support until 2030, and for the integration of geospatial information and technologies in the post-2030 agenda.

• Disaster and Climate Resilience: The session emphasized the importance of integrating geospatial information and Earth intelligence for climate resilience and disaster risk management.

• DEI: The importance of diversity, equity, and inclusion, particularly gender balance, was emphasized and welcomed throughout discussions about the composition of the secretariat, networks, centers, and other representatives.

The session also provided an exciting opportunity for our team to meet with several members of the SDGs Today Coalition of Experts (Dr. Mohammed Al-Sayel, Lóránt Czárán, and Aaron Addison) focusing on joint efforts and addressing the session's outcomes to advance these critical areas.!


